

Miller Breaks Long Jump Record By Judy Rogers

Golden Plains junior KayCee Miller set a new school record in long jump for first place at the Logan Invitational on May 1. She jumped 16' 5.25" to break her own record of 16' 4.75" set last year at Regionals. Miller placed 7th in state last season, but this was her first time to long jump this season.

"It felt really good to come back to long jump where I left off," said Miller. "I haven't been working on it. The weather kept me from practicing the week before the meet." continued Miller. "I decided that I had a better chance at state in long jump after I saw the jumps from this year. I have qualified the last two years and wanted to try again. I will continue to work on it this season in hopes of making it back to Cessna Stadium for the state track meet!"

Miller will compete again in the Colby Invitational on May 4 and at the WKLL meet on May 11 before going to Regionals in hopes of a return trip to state.
